| Time Until Start of Event | Percentage Refund |
|---------------------------|-------------------|
| Up to 14 days prior | 80% refund |
| Up to 7 days prior | 60% refund |
| 7 days or less | No refund* |

- Participants who cancel from an event within 7 days will be considered for up to a 60% refund if the
 refund request is accompanied by a Doctor's note. Requests under these circumstances will not be
 considered if not received at the Council Service Center less than 14 days after the start of the event.
- There will be no special considerations for Covid.

Forms, Forms, Forms

- EVERYONE needs a current AHMR Parts A, B, and C
 - Part C requires a Physician's Signature and is only good for one calendar year
- Youth must have one (1) copy of the Firearms Permission Slip in order to use the ranges.
 - We will be identifying those youth with permissions by their wristband
- Dietary Restrictions may not be accommodated if received less than two weeks prior to arrival
- <u>ALL</u> Adults must be <u>fully registered</u> (i.e. submitted their application, completed YPT, completed AB-506, and completed their CBC with National), not provisionally registered, to attend camp.

Clothing Guidelines

- The GGAC pulled together an ad hoc Clothing Guidelines team to draw up some commonsense clothing guidelines for our camps.

Propane Exchange

- Little Kampers (https://littlekamper.com/) is a propane exchange company.
- They will be giving a case of full exchangeable propane bottles to all of our Troops in camp this year as long as the Troop agrees to participate in the exchange program and help eliminate waste.
- Most REI's and Ace Hardware in the state are exchange locations.
- We are the first council in BSA to officially partner with them to eliminate propane waste and our Troops and leadership benefit by getting these bottles for free which is a \$264 value.

Trekker Troop 23

- This is a rebranding of our Provisional Camper Program. In 2023 we learned that 20% of the Scouts who did not attend camp, did not do so because the week their troop attended, they had a conflict.
- To help meet the growing demand of our Scouts and their families we are launching Trekker Troop 23, which will be a Troop in camp with Leadership provided by the staff and a group of Scouts who can come and work on advancement and participate in camp just as they would with their home troop.
